Overview and Objectives:

This is a one-semester lecture course covering the drugs commonly used in anesthesiology. This means the discussion of inhaled and intravenous anesthetics, drugs acting on the autonomic nervous system, the myoneural junction as well as antihistaminics, sedatives, cardiovascular agents and the most important antibiotics. Basic mechanisms of action will be elucidated with an emphasis on their clinical applications.
